Calvary Preschool is built on a biblical foundation, and more specifically, a Christ-centered philosophy of education. Let me briefly explain.

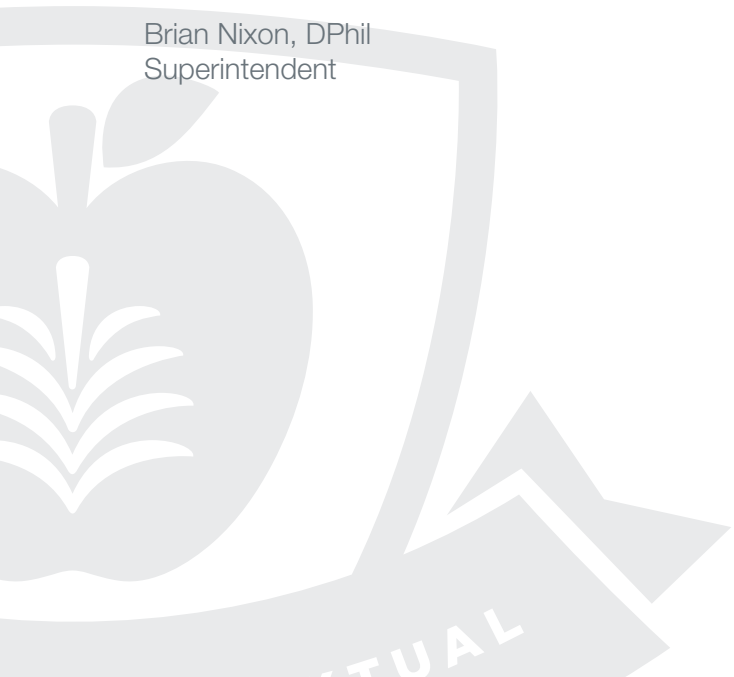

Section 1: General Information

Statement of Faith

WHAT WE BELIEVE AT CALVARY CHURCH

We Believe that there is one living and true God, eternally existing in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, equal in power and glory; this triune God created all, upholds all, and governs all according to the purpose of His will.

GOD THE FATHER

We Believe that God is essentially Spirit, personal, transcendent, sovereign, life, love, truth, almighty, timelessly eternal, unchangeable, wise, just, holy, relational, pure actuality, dynamic, infallible in all things, including His foreknowledge of all future decisions and events.

We Believe that God the Father concerns Himself mercifully in the affairs of men; that He hears and answers prayer; and that He saves from sin and death all who come to Him through faith in Jesus Christ.

GOD THE SON

We Believe in Jesus Christ—the second person of the Godhead, God's only begotten Son, the promised Messiah, conceived by the Holy Spirit.

We Believe in His virgin birth, sinless life, miracles, teachings, bodily resurrection, ascension into heaven, perpetual intercession for His people, and personal, visible return to earth.

We Believe that Jesus Christ is fully God and fully human, possessing two distinct natures which are co-joined in one person, and that He provided for the atonement of our sins by His vicarious, substitutionary death on the cross.

GOD THE HOLY SPIRIT

We Believe in the Holy Spirit—the third person of the Godhead, who came forth from the Father and Son to convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment; and to regenerate, sanctify, and empower all who believe in Jesus Christ for ministry.

We Believe that the Holy Spirit indwells every believer in Jesus Christ and that He is an abiding helper, teacher, and guide.

We Believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit and in the exercise of all the biblical gifts of the Holy Spirit, to be employed within scriptural guidelines. We believe that love is more important than the most spectacular gifts, and without this love, all exercise of spiritual gifts is worthless.

THE BIBLE

We Believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the Word of God, fully inspired without error in their original manuscripts and are the infallible rule of faith and practice. The Bible is the foundation upon which the church operates and is the basis for which the church is governed. We believe that the Bible supersedes any earthly law that is contrary to the Holy Scriptures.

We Believe that we are to faithfully teach the Bible in such a way that its message can be applied to an individual's life, leading that person to greater maturity in Christ. We do this by explaining the relevance of the Bible to empower and transform lives for service.

CREATION

We Believe that God is the Creator and Sustainer of the heavens and the earth and of every basic form of life. We believe that God created all things *ex nihilo* (out of nothing) as taught in the book of Genesis, calling it good. We believe that God exercises providential care for every life form in His creation, and calls Christians to be faithful stewards of the natural world.

We Believe that God created man and woman as unique biological persons made to complete each other. God instituted monogamous marriage between male and female as the foundation of the family and the basic structure of human society. For this reason, we believe that marriage is exclusively the union of one genetic male and one genetic female, sanctioned by the church and recognized by the state as evidenced by a marriage ceremony.

HUMANITY

We Believe that man is created in the image of God; however, after the fall of Adam and Eve, all people are by nature separated from God and responsible for their own sin, but that salvation, redemption, and forgiveness are offered as a free gift to all by the Lord Jesus Christ based on His grace alone.

We Believe that when a person repents of sin and receives Jesus Christ as their personal Savior and Lord, trusting Him to save, that person is immediately born again and sealed by the Holy Spirit, all their sins are forgiven, and they become a child of God, destined to spend eternity with the Lord.

We Believe that Jesus Christ baptizes the seeking believer with the Holy Spirit and empowers believers for service, often subsequent to regeneration.

THE CHURCH

We Believe in the universal church, the living spiritual body, of which Christ is the Head, and all regenerated persons are members.

We Believe that Jesus committed two ordinances to the church: 1) baptism and 2) the Lord's Supper. We believe in baptism by immersion and Communion open to all believers.

We Believe in the laying on of hands for the baptism of the Holy Spirit, for ordination of pastors, elders, and deacons, and receiving from the Holy Spirit through the believer the gift of healing.

We Believe that the church has the responsibility to worship the Lord and share the good news of Christ's death and resurrection to the world, making disciples, baptizing believers, and teaching them to observe sound doctrine and to live a holy life.

CHRIST'S RETURN

We Believe in the personal, visible return of Christ to the earth and the establishment of His kingdom, in the resurrection of the body, the final judgment and eternal blessing of the righteous, and the endless suffering of the wicked.

HISTORIC WITNESS

We Believe in what is termed the Apostles' Creed as embodying the fundamental facts of Christian faith.

I believe in God, the Father almighty,
Creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
He descended into hell.
The third day He rose again from the dead.
He ascended to heaven
and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty.
From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy universal church,
the communion of the saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.

WHO WE ARE

Calvary Church is a fellowship of believers who pursue the God who passionately pursues a lost world; we do this by connecting with one another, through worship, by the Word, to the world.

Our Purpose

CREATING LIFE CHANGE

At Calvary Church, we create environments that minimize awkwardness and remove obstacles, believing this will maximize belonging and create opportunities for life change. We want people to feel loved, cared for, and comfortable, because we believe this makes them more receptive to the Word. We want to implement this in everything we do including our worship experience, giving experience, Connect Group experience, and children's ministry, as well as on our websites. Everything we do is about creating life change and we want to build and provide opportunities for change in every realm of life: spiritually, relationally, professionally, and emotionally. We want to see people give their lives to Jesus Christ and become better husbands and wives, mothers and fathers, and employees and business owners. A relationship with Jesus makes life better—and it makes you better at life.

Our Goal

As a church body, we believe that the Scriptures teach that the best care for young children is given by their parents (see Deuteronomy 6:6-7 and Proverbs 22:6). However, we realize that sometimes there are extenuating circumstances that require parents to work outside the home. Calvary Preschool staff is called to share in the ministry of Calvary Church by providing a loving and safe learning environment for children during the workday when circumstances prevent spouses or relatives from providing that care themselves.

Calvary Preschool staff strives to glorify God by providing an orderly, nurturing, and stimulating atmosphere for development as children begin to explore the world around them. Each child in Calvary Preschool will grow mentally, physically, socially, and spiritually as they interact with a loving, caring group of adults and peers outside of their family. The Calvary Preschool program's daily environment includes guided exploration with toys and educational manipulatives that stimulate learning, peer interaction that stimulates social growth, and a creative, hands-on academic and Bible curriculum that is appropriate for each child's spiritual and academic growth and development.

Calvary Church History

Skip Heitzig is a native of southern California and experienced the volatile days of the counterculture in the late '60s and early '70s. Though raised in a religious home, Skip saw religion as a dead-end street with no answers. As a teenager, he got caught up in drugs and ventured into the occult. But God reached Skip one day in 1973 as he was watching a Billy Graham crusade on TV. The gospel message penetrated his soul, and he knelt and prayed to receive Christ.

Skip studied under Chuck Smith at Calvary Chapel of Costa Mesa, California, until 1981. After he married Lenya, the couple moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico, where he worked in the medical field of radiology. In 1982, Skip began a home Bible study, which eventually grew into Calvary Church. In 1988 and 1989, Calvary Church was considered the fastest growing church in America. Today, Calvary Church ministers to over 15,000 people every weekend. Calvary Church has been instrumental in planting other churches, including several in Arizona, Colorado, and other parts of New Mexico.

Skip and his wife, Lenya, and son and daughter-in-law, Nathan and Janaé, live in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Skip and Lenya are the proud grandparents of Seth Nathaniel and Kaydence Joy.

Calvary Preschool began as an extension of Calvary Church. Skip's desire to pursue God in all areas led to the formation of the preschool in 2015.

Educational Framework and Values

PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT

Calvary Preschool's academic pedagogy (teaching path) follows the biblical norm of training up the whole child: academically, physically, spiritually, and socially (see Luke 2:52 and Mark 12:30). Our pedagogy is best understood in the word *paideia*. The apostle Paul used the word in relationship to children, stating, “Bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord” (Ephesians 6:4, NIV). The Greek word used for *training* is *paideia*. *Paideia* is a full-orbed instruction, encompassing all aspects of life. In the context of this verse, a Christian educator's role is to train children to think Christianlike about all subjects, incorporating the adage “All truth is God's truth.”

WISDOM

“Jesus increased in wisdom” (Luke 2:52).

Calvary Preschool follows the time-tested educational framework of liberal education (meaning *broad* or *wide* education), placing a special emphasis on the classical pursuits of grammar, logic (clear thinking), and rhetoric (clear speaking), thereby introducing students to a broad and well-rounded form of education.

Historically, in a liberal arts framework, early childhood education emphasizes biblical, philosophical, and musical instruction. Calvary Preschool incorporates these facets into a well-rounded, whole-child approach.

STATURE

“Jesus increased in...stature” (Luke 2:52).

As important as academic growth is to a child, it is not the only facet. The Bible is clear: the body is critical to our life in Christ (see 1 Corinthians 6:19). Not only did Jesus grow in wisdom, but He also grew physically. Because of this, Calvary Preschool places a strong emphasis on kinesthetic activity through physical education, motor skills development, sports, and, for the younger ages, play. Regular physical activity will be part of the child’s day.

FAVOR WITH GOD

“Jesus increased...in favor with God” (Luke 2:52).

Because Jesus modeled spiritual growth, Calvary Preschool exists to make disciples of Jesus Christ through a biblical school environment that prepares students to glorify God with their whole life. The Great Commission is at the very heart of all we do as a fellowship of believers committed to a quality biblical education. It is our desire to come alongside Christian families and partner with them in the pursuit of godly character and education for their children. We recognize that this partnership calls for the like-mindedness of all who are involved in the education process, so that each student’s academic and spiritual development may reach maturity in Christ. Calvary Preschool sees God’s revelation of truth in two spheres: specific (Scripture) and general (revealed in nature). Put another way, God wrote two books—the Bible and His creation, or His words and His world.

FAVOR WITH MAN

“Jesus increased...in favor with...men” (Luke 2:52).

Social growth is important to the life of a Christian child. Not only did Jesus model this growth, but the Bible is clear in its teaching that we should treat other people with respect, love, and compassion, living peaceably with all (see Romans 12:18). Because of this, Calvary Preschool places a strong emphasis on teaching children the appropriate social skills for a life of success both spiritually and earthly. As Robert Littlejohn and Charles T. Evans have expressed, “We aim to shape individuals who are both heavenly minded and capable of doing great earthly good.”

Curriculum Statement

At Calvary Preschool, we have strategically chosen our curriculum to accomplish our educational goals of fostering a whole-child approach embodying our four pillars of education: wisdom, stature, favor with God, and favor with man.

We do this with the understanding that children are uniquely created by God and mature and develop at different rates. Our program is unique in that it provides a solid academic foundation that is teacher-directed with a hands-on learning approach that engages students in a fun and interactive environment.

The teachers do this by implementing some of the best approaches to learning, such as: visual, auditory, kinesthetic, student discovery, and problem solving.

Section 2: Program Information

Programs

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The three-year-old program uses curricula from BJU Press called Pathways for Preschool as well as ABEKA. These curricula include daily lessons that focus on:

- Letter identification and sound recognition of all uppercase and lowercase letters
- Beginning letter formation
- Number identification and one-to-one correspondence
- Exercises that help students with sorting, patterning, classification, and sequencing
- Learning nursery rhymes and easy-to-sing songs
- Hands-on/interactive observation skills
- Numerous art projects
- Motor skill activities

These concepts are reinforced with fun crafts, centers, games, songs, and rhymes.

The pre-K program utilizes two different curricula. Students are assessed, and based on the assessment and personality, they are placed in the class that best fits them.

The ABEKA K4 curriculum encourages important academic skills that prepare students for Kindergarten. This program incorporates:

- Letter identification, formation, and sound recognition of all uppercase and lowercase letters
- Phonics
- Beginning prereading skills
- Handwriting
- Number recognition, beginning addition/subtraction, and other math skills
- Heritage studies
- Science
- Teacher-directed and free art activities
- Music

These concepts are reinforced with fun crafts, centers, games, songs, and rhymes.

The BJU Press Footsteps for Fours encourages important academic skills that prepare students for Kindergarten. The pre-K teachers also incorporate parts of the BJU Press Kindergarten Program for both math and language.

The math program features age-appropriate stories, colorful illustrations, and connections to real-world problems. The lessons give pre-K students a firm mathematical foundation for their future education by developing an understanding of:

- Number recognition
- Counting and writing numbers
- One-to-one correspondence
- Basic addition and subtraction
- Measurement
- Patterning and sequencing

The language arts program for pre-K students is called Kindergarten Beginnings. In this program:

- Phonics instruction is presented in a logical format including phonemic awareness that identifies beginning, middle, and end sounds.
- Letter-sound associations are strengthened by utilizing real words and decodable words with predictable patterns.
- The stage is set for comprehension-centered reading through listening lessons and phonics stories that provide practice for new skills and foster comprehension.
- Handwriting instruction is taught using precursive letter formations.
- Students participate in writing activities that promote the reading/writing connection through class dictation stories and independent writing for those who are ready for that skill.

Please Note: When deciding what Calvary Preschool program to enroll your child in, consider that the average academic advancement of students depends on the number of days they attend school.

Calvary Preschool's pre-K program is a five-day program. Students who attend three days instead of five will miss instruction and activities presented on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Students in our three- and four-year-old programs who attend two days instead of three will be exposed to academic curriculum, but they will not experience the extension and reinforcement lessons that allow students to further solidify presented concepts.

Tuition Payment Policies

Calvary Preschool is pleased to offer **Brightwheel**, a free online portal for you to access account information and easily pay tuition. Brightwheel is safe, secure, and created with your convenience in mind.

- Tuition is due on the first of the month. You will not receive a monthly invoice for tuition.
- A \$25 late fee may be assessed if payment is not received in a timely manner. Arrangements can be made with the accounting office to avoid a late fee.
- If your account is thirty days past due, your child may be disenrolled at the director's discretion and action will be taken to recover payment.
- You must give a one-month written notice to withdraw your child. Upon receiving notice, tuition will not be charged after the date of withdrawal. If you fail to give written notice, however, you will be charged for an additional month. If you fail to pay, further action will be taken.

School Year Schedule

Calvary Preschool is an academic school that follows an academic calendar year. Our school year session has a fall semester and a spring semester. There is no class on Labor Day, fall break, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving break, Christmas break, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, spring break, and Good Friday. You will be notified if another day off is necessary (e.g., for local or national elections or professional development days for teachers and the preschool director).

Parent/teacher conferences are held in the spring. There is no school on these days. Please refer to the school calendar (posted on our website: calvarychurchpreschool.com) for dates.

School Celebrations

Calvary Preschool holds multiple special events throughout the year. Some special event days will not have After Care. Tuition rates will reflect the missed days; you will not be charged. Please refer to the school year calendar for all special event dates, including:

Enrollment Procedures

- To determine if Calvary Preschool is the right fit for your child, please carefully review this Parent Handbook as well as the information found at calvarychurchpreschool.com.
- If Calvary Preschool is the right place for your child, apply online and answer the few preliminary questions there.
- We will contact you within five days of applying, and you'll receive an email to finish the registration process.
- Once registration is complete, we will contact you to schedule an admissions meeting. This is an opportunity for the preschool director to become familiar with the student and family. School enrollment will be decided at this time.
- After these steps are complete, your child is an official Calvary Preschool student.

Enrollment Requirements

1. Calvary Preschool is a Christian preschool for Christian families. It is important for our preschool families to understand the value of God's Word and model His Word in our daily lives. Before enrollment is secure, we mandate that one parent be a believing Christian who is able to sign the Parent Pledge in agreement with our Statement of Faith (p. 35).
2. Must have updated immunizations record or vaccine exemption.
3. Must be program age by dates previously stated.
4. Must be fully toilet trained. No diapers or pull-ups. Must be able to wipe themselves.

Nondiscrimination Policy

Calvary Preschool is mindful of our primary mission to be witnesses of the love of Christ for all. It is the policy of Calvary Preschool not to discriminate against any current student or student applicant because of race, color, sex, national origin, and/or ethnic origin, and we afford all students equal rights and privileges in regard to the administration of our educational policies, admissions policies, and other school-administered programs and activities. While Calvary Preschool does not discriminate against students with special needs, a full range of services may not be available.

Partnership Plan

Calvary Preschool strives to serve each student with care and compassion, helping them flourish academically, physically, spiritually, and socially. There are times, however, when a student's needs outweigh our ability to help them thrive, and we are unable to create and/or implement educational plans (e.g., an individualized educational plan [IEP]).

Nevertheless, we partner with parents and the designated educational/professional institution to establish standard protocols to ensure students' growth. We call this our Partnership Plan, where we partner with the parents and professionals to achieve student success.

If we feel that we are not adequately helping the student succeed, we will help the parents find an alternative path, seeking the student's well-being according to their needs.

Faith-Based Belief Policy

Calvary Preschool is a faith-based preschool governed by the principles of the Holy Scripture as stated in the Statement of Faith. Therefore, Calvary Preschool reserves the right to deny admission to the preschool if a student's family does not agree to the principles contained in the Statement of Faith or the stated mission and goals of the preschool. Calvary Preschool may reject applications for enrollment that the Calvary Preschool administration, in its judgment, determines are not consistent with the principles and purpose of Calvary Preschool.

Section 3: Parent Involvement

Communication

It is very important to keep in communication with the director and/or your child's teacher regarding any issues or concerns you may have. Please keep in mind that discussing such issues or concerns during class while other students are in the room is unwarranted. If you would like to have a brief discussion with your child's teacher, please schedule a time before or after class that works best for both parties.

Your child's teacher will send home daily updates, monthly newsletters, and classroom information. Calvary Preschool uses a communication system through the Brightwheel app. We will send information and reminders via text or email or through the app.

If you would like to speak with the director, stop by the school administration office, call, or email any time. We know how important communication is to the success of your child and our school. We are here for you.

Orientation/Meet-the-Teacher Day

To kick off every school year, Calvary Preschool hosts a parent orientation/meet-the-teacher day for our students and their families. This is an opportunity for students and parents to meet their teacher, tour the school, connect with other families, familiarize themselves with our day-to-day schedule, and ask any questions they have. For this date, please refer to the school calendar issued at the time of registration.

Student Sign-In/Out

Each student must be escorted into and out of the building. Upon arrival and checkout, you must check your child in/out using our Brightwheel app on your cell phone or at the check-in/out kiosk. State regulations require that each child be checked in and out every day. Please ensure that everyone authorized to drop off/pick up your child does the same.

Student Drop-Off and Pickup

1. Our school learning session promptly begins at 9 am. We welcome students into the preschool no earlier than 8:40 am. Please be on time. It is disruptive to the class when a student is late. If a student arrives after 9 am, you will be asked to wait with your child outside of the classroom door until the morning activity is complete, so as not to cause a distraction.
2. Please remember to follow the check-in/out procedures.
3. We realize how difficult it may be leaving your child—especially for the first time. The best approach to make the goodbye process easier is to make it a short one. If your child senses that you are reluctant or nervous about leaving them, they become even more anxious about being left. You may want to develop a quick goodbye routine. Having a predictable routine helps your child adjust quickly. Please do not attempt to sneak away unnoticed.
4. Our school dismissal time is 1 pm. Please make every attempt to pick up your child on time. We understand that certain circumstances can make you late. If this is the case, please call the school at 505.338.0183 so we can reassure your child.
5. If someone other than yourself is picking up your child, we must have prior written authorization. Upon arrival, the person that you authorized will be asked to present a picture ID before we release your child to their care.
6. If you have not arrived to pick up your child by 1:20 pm and you have not attempted to contact the school, your child will be sent to After Care.
7. **Once a student is released from school to a parent or authorized party, legal responsibility for that student passes from the school to the parent or authorized party. Please make sure your child does not leave the building without you.**

Living Arrangements

If we need to be aware of certain living arrangements (child custody, restraining orders, divorce, death, etc.) please let us know so we can work with you to ensure what is best for your child. The happiness and safety of your child is very important to us. Please provide us with any necessary documentation (if any).

Parent-Teacher Conferences

At Calvary Preschool, our desire is to be *in loco parentis*, a Latin term meaning *in the place of parents*. We take seriously our call to nurture, teach, love, and care for the students entrusted to us. Unlike many preschools that do not hold parent-teacher conferences, Calvary Preschool deems them essential to our mission as a school, helping develop students academically, physically, spiritually, and socially.

Some of our classes have too many students to hold conferences within two short days, so we allow our teachers to hold them before and after school to allow for more time with parents, encouraging deeper insight and questions. These conferences may be held within two weeks before or after the scheduled conference dates.

Furthermore, in certain cases such as domestic situations, Calvary Preschool reserves the right to schedule an online conference instead of in-person, so all parties are given the same information.

Because our goal is for our students to flourish, we count it a privilege to partner with parents in the education of their students. Together we have the high calling to cultivate and train our future leaders.

Gossip

We encourage you to share the positive accomplishments of the preschool and individual students. A safe learning environment takes precedence over gossip. When a child does something inappropriate, it is important that it is kept between the adult(s) who saw it, the teachers, and the child's parents. If a child knows that their inappropriate actions will not be the topic of gossip, they will continue viewing the school as a safe environment.

Parent Volunteer Opportunities

Calvary Preschool has an open-door policy. You are always welcome at your child's school. If you would like to volunteer, you must pass a criminal records background check by being fingerprinted. There is a \$60 total charge for the fingerprinting and for the ECECD background clearance processing fee.

Due to heightened security, parent volunteers must schedule visits with their child's teacher and the preschool director. Volunteer visits must be conducive to a helpful learning environment and mirror Calvary's Educational Framework and Values, located on pages 9 and 10 of the Parent Handbook. When volunteering at the school, please check in with the school administration office to receive a visitor badge. Please make arrangements for siblings, as we are unable to accommodate them in the classroom.

We do not allow parents to volunteer in the classroom during the first four weeks of school. It is important for your child to adjust to their new surroundings and gain a sense of familiarity with the school. This adjustment time takes about two to four weeks for most children.

There are many opportunities throughout the school year for you to help in your child's class, the administrative office, or with special events. Parents and families are encouraged to attend Calvary Preschool's Paideia Parent Fellowship (PTF).

At PTF meetings, we aim to encourage one another by sharing practical information, including ways to serve our students, staff, and school, and biblical information related to parenting skills and strategies. We also pray for our families. PTF provides an opportunity to build relationships within the school community, get to know staff and other parents, find out more about school happenings, and help you teach students and children the importance of serving others. Together, we make Calvary Preschool a unique place for our students and children to grow as Christ did, in wisdom, stature, favor with God, and favor with men. These meetings will be held quarterly.

Social Media

Due to the sensitive nature—and various family circumstances (e.g., divorce, endangerment, etc.)—concerning social media, Calvary Preschool asks that all families refrain from posting pictures of other students (children not your own) on personal social media accounts, whether taken at school or during school events, without specific permission granted by the families of other students, thereby safeguarding their privacy. For example, if you snap a photo of your child with another student during a field trip, we ask that you get permission from the other student's parent or guardian before posting. Section 4: Student Policies

Clothing/Dress Code

For the safety of our students, Calvary Preschool implements a dress code that promotes school unity. All students will be required to wear a school uniform of the same color.

1. Bottoms
 - Navy blue
 - Boys: pants, shorts
 - Girls: pants, shorts, skirts, jumpers (shorts must be worn underneath skirts and jumpers)
2. Tops
 - Light blue polo-type shirts
 - Short- or long-sleeved (in cooler months)
3. Socks
 - Any color
 - Visible socks and tights are allowed
4. Shoes
 - Closed-toe shoes must be worn
 - Backless shoes are not allowed
 - No Crocs-style shoes
5. At the time of admission and at Parent Orientation, you will have an opportunity to purchase a Calvary Preschool spirit t-shirt. This shirt may be worn on Thursdays or Fridays.
6. Please provide an extra change of clothing for your child in a Ziploc bag to be left in their backpack. While we have bathroom breaks often, accidents do happen. Make sure to put your child's name on this bag. Three year olds will need two extra changes of clothes.
7. During the cooler months, send your child with a weather-appropriate sweater or jacket. Please put your child's name on all easily removable clothing, especially jackets.
8. **Leave all small or detachable articles at home, such as pins, rings, toiletries, money, toys, candy, gum, etc.**

Backpack

Please send your child to school with a backpack that is large enough to accommodate their home folder and projects. Your child's name should be clearly labeled on the backpack.

Illness

If your child is not feeling well or you suspect that they are contagious, please do not send them to school. If your child has a fever (100.4° or higher), rash, diarrhea, sore throat, discolored nasal discharge (if it's colored, it's not allergies; this signals infection), constant cough, discharge from eyes, is vomiting, or has any symptoms of a contagious illness, please keep them home. A good rule to follow when determining whether to send your child to school is when in doubt, don't.

If your child has a fever or any of the symptoms above, please do not send them to school until twenty-four fever/symptom-free hours have passed.

If your child becomes ill while at school, we will call you or the emergency contact person you have provided on your child's information card. Your child will be separated from the group and allowed to rest comfortably until someone comes to get them. It is important to keep your child's information card updated at all times.

If your child has been diagnosed with any of the following, you must notify the school:

- Chicken pox
- Conjunctivitis
- Hepatitis A
- Herpes (mouth sores)
- Measles/rubella
- Mumps
- Pertussis (whooping cough)
- Rash illness
- Scabies
- Head lice
- Impetigo

Your child will not be allowed to return to school until necessary treatments have been given and/or a note has been issued from the child's doctor clearing their return.

Please inform us if your child develops a communicable disease.

If your child is ill, please call in your child's absence to the school administration office at 338.0183 between the hours of 8:30 am and 5 pm. If your child has missed school for three consecutive days due to illness, we require a doctor's note upon their return.

Medication

Calvary Preschool does not dispense cold medication at the school. On school mornings, please do not use medication such as Tylenol or cough syrup to mask symptoms that would otherwise prevent your child from attending school.

If your child has a special medical need such as asthma, diabetes, or a food allergy, a parent and the child's healthcare provider must sign an authorization form allowing preschool staff to administer the necessary medication. Please send the medication in its original container with your child's name, dosage, expiration date, and medicine name visible. If a plan of action form is necessary and is provided by your child's pediatrician, please provide the school with a copy to keep on file.

Sunscreens, lotions, and chapstick are considered medication. Please apply to your child before school; do not send these items with your child.

Accident, Injuries, or Emergencies Involving a Child

Each parent must provide written authorization for removing a child from the school for emergency medical transportation or treatment and must designate a physician and preferred medical facility for treatment in case your child becomes ill or is injured while at school. In the case of an accident, injury, or emergency, trained staff will administer first aid as needed. The director will be informed immediately of the incident, and Calvary Safety will be called to assist. If Calvary Safety or the director deems it necessary, 911 will be called. The administrative assistant will notify parents without delay. If no one can be reached that is recorded on the child's contact information in a reasonable amount of time, depending on the nature of the emergency, the child will be taken to the nearest facility. If the child is transported by ambulance before the parents arrive at the preschool, the director will accompany the child to the hospital. Incident/accident reports must be filled out and filed in the preschool and safety offices.

In the event of a dental accident, trained staff will administer first aid as needed. The director will be informed immediately of the incident, and Calvary Safety will be called to assist. The parents will be notified by the administrative assistant, and the director will contact the child's dentist to seek recommendations for immediate treatment until the parents arrive. Incident/accident reports must be filled out and filed in the preschool and safety offices.

If an injury cannot be treated with on-site first aid and requires emergency medical attention, it will be reported to the state licensing authority by Calvary Preschool and will be followed by a written report.

Section 5: School Policies

Emergency Evacuation Plan

In the event of an on-campus emergency, precautions are in place for the overall safety of the children.

In the event of a fire, gas leak, or bomb threat, Calvary Preschool staff will escort students to White Cap located at 6707 Washington Street NE. They can be reached at 872.2244.

In the event of a tornado, severe weather, or terrorism, students will be escorted to the Calvary Kids offices. They will have an emergency supply of bottled water, wipes, a flashlight, blanket, first-aid kit, nonperishable food, and other emergency items.

In the event of an evacuation, Calvary Preschool staff will escort students to White Cap located at 6707 Washington Street NE. They can be reached at 872.2244.

We will call and text, and teachers will send a message on the Brightwheel app to parents and guardians to inform them of the situation and provide pickup instructions.

Our route: take the nearest and safest exit, walk west toward Washington Street, cross into the White Cap parking lot, and enter through the south entrance.

If White Cap is also in a state of emergency, we will go to Whataburger, located at 4201 Osuna Rd. NE. They can be reached at 344.4212.

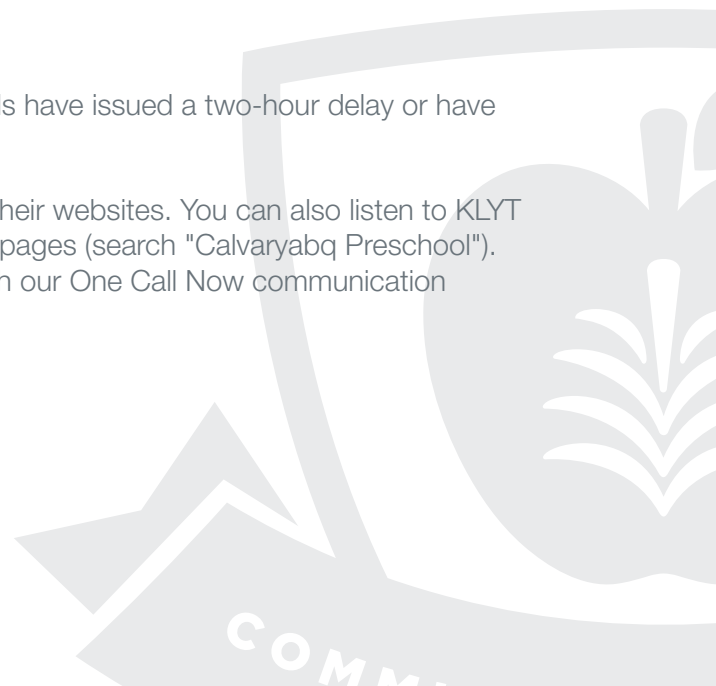
Our route to Whataburger: take the nearest and safest exit and walk to the east parking lot toward Calvary Rd.

In the event of an emergency, any person(s) with a disability will be aided to safety.

School Closings

Calvary Preschool will close when Albuquerque Public Schools have issued a two-hour delay or have canceled classes.

Check for closings or delays with local news stations and/or their websites. You can also listen to KLYT (88.3 FM) or check the preschool's Facebook and Instagram pages (search "Calvaryabq Preschool"). You will also receive communication via text and email through our One Call Now communication portal and from teachers through the Brightwheel app.



Field Trips

In-house field trips are scheduled throughout the school year. Currently, Calvary Preschool is not conducting off-campus field trips.

Chapel

Calvary Preschool is committed to instilling Bible truths into the hearts and minds of our students. In line with our school's philosophy, we strive to educate the whole child, in wisdom, stature, favor with God, and favor with man.

We recognize that each child is unique and created in the image of God. We desire to come alongside our families and students in the instruction of God's Word so that each student will understand the magnitude of God's love for them. At the preschool stages of development, children understand the world around them in a concrete and literal sense. Our program is designed to help students understand that the Bible is a historical, God-breathed document. To communicate these concepts to our students, we partner with The Beginner's Bible to create a specialized program for daily Bible instruction and chapel.

Guidance Policy

"The wise in heart are called discerning, and pleasant words promote instruction"
(Proverbs 16:21, NIV).

Discipline is a door for opportunity—the opportunity to teach children appropriate ways to meet their needs. The root word for *discipline* is *disciple*, so good discipline, like discipleship, trains children to develop self-control. *Training* is the key word, not *punishment*. Good discipline is guidance toward right behavior. The goal of discipline in the classroom is to train children to be Christlike. Before any method of discipline is used, there must first be rules. Rules are reviewed daily with the students, as well as what appropriate behavior looks like in the classroom setting.

CLASSROOM RULES

Classroom rules provide principles for godly behavior in an academic setting. They establish healthy limits for children and provide a framework in which biblical teaching and learning can take place. We desire for our children to understand the Bible's instruction that love is obedience: "He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and manifest Myself to him" (John 14:21).

The classroom rules are posted in each classroom, large enough to be seen from any place in the room. They are taught and reviewed daily with our children in an ongoing and inspiring manner.

1. **Be loving.** “You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.... You shall love your neighbor as yourself” (Matthew 22:37, 39).
2. **Be obedient.** “Obey those who rule over you, and be submissive, for they watch out for your souls, as those who must give account” (Hebrews 13:17).
3. **Be patient.** “The patient in spirit is better than the proud in spirit” (Ecclesiastes 7:8b).
4. **Be diligent.** “Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth” (2 Timothy 2:15).
5. **Be self-controlled.** “He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit than he who takes a city” (Proverbs 16:32).

Parent-Interaction Etiquette

Since Calvary Preschool serves a host of families from differing backgrounds, socioeconomic groups, and family dynamics, we take seriously our call to be *in loco parentis*, a Latin term meaning *in the place of parents*. In other words, we are passionate about our call to nurture, teach, love, and care for the students—and families—entrusted to us.

Because of the diverse background of the families we minister to, we want to outline some basic etiquette criteria that will assist both the school and families when it comes to our meetings. These basic guidelines will help our time together run smoothly, with care and compassion in mind.

1. **Be Respectful**
 - Communicate respectfully with staff, other parents, and children. Do not use harsh or inappropriate language, make negative comments, or posture yourself above others.
 - Be respectful in written and verbal communication.
2. **Be a Listener**
 - Listen actively.
 - Be open to feedback from teachers and administrators.
3. **Be Punctual**
 - Arrive on time for drop-off and pickup.
 - Punctuality helps maintain the daily routine and ensures a smooth transition for your child and the other children in the classroom.
 - If you’re running late, notify the school in advance. You may be asked to disenroll your child if you are habitually late.
4. **Be Positive**
 - Parents serve as role models for their children. Demonstrate kindness, patience, and good manners.
 - Show respect for school property and follow rules (e.g., parking guidelines, etc.).

5. Be Professional

- Teachers have a professional role to play in a child's life. The teacher's primary responsibility is to educate and support the child academically, physically, spiritually, and mentally (see Luke 2:52).
- Involving a student in personal matters outside the classroom blurs these boundaries and can create confusion for both the child and the teacher.
- Calvary Preschool will not tolerate any parental bullying of schoolteachers, staff, students, or families. Bullying can be **physical** (use of their body or object to hurt or scare another person), **verbal** (use of words to mock, intimidate, or make fun of an individual), **cyber** (use of electronic communication to bully, typically by sending messages of an intimidating or threatening nature), or **emotional** (a form of abuse where a person manipulates, intimidates, and undermines an individual's self-esteem and confidence). If a parent engages in bullying behavior, they will be given a warning. If bullying persists, their student is subject to immediate withdrawal at the judgment of the preschool director or head of schools.

6. Be Sensitive

- School is a place for learning and growth; however, we understand families face sensitive real-life issues—divorce, separation, health problems, and death. When facing any of these circumstances, we ask that you notify the school so we can pray for you and offer deeper love and care to the student.
- In certain situations, such as divorce or separation issues, we ask that in-school communication be minimal, only conveying the facts pertaining to the care and nurture of your child.
- In the case of divorce or separation, Calvary Preschool will not take sides and will not discuss hurtful family dynamics with either family. These conversations can distract teachers from their core responsibilities.
- Any legal issues pertaining to family dynamics will need to be made by court order. We will follow the instructions of state or federal law.
- In all situations, maintaining a positive and focused educational environment for all students is essential.

Discipline Policy

At Calvary Preschool, we believe that children are a gift from God and are His beautiful creations. It is our job to show them love, guidance, and understanding in a gentle manner.

A very important part of the preschool experience is helping children learn how to get along in the world, enjoy being with other children, and follow the direction of an adult other than their parent. A caring and positive approach is taken regarding behavior management and discipline. The teachers focus on the positive behaviors of the children and reinforce those behaviors as often as possible. Our goal is to help children develop self-control and responsibility for their actions.

Our discipline procedures consist of the following strategies:

1. Encourage children to use their words when having a disagreement with another child. Facilitate children in their attempts to settle their own disputes.
2. Redirect behavior when this seems potentially effective.
3. Separate a child from the group for a short time.

4. Counsel children individually about their behaviors.
5. Make director and parents aware of disciplinary concerns (incident report).

If your child is sent to the director's office more than three documented times, your child may be withdrawn from the school and any remaining tuition will be forfeited. More than three documented incidents of hitting, biting, or behavior that puts other children or staff members in danger will not be tolerated and is grounds for dismissal. We reserve the right to dismiss a child on a case-by-case basis.

Bullying Policy

People are made in God's image (see Genesis 1); therefore, we have intrinsic value and purpose. As representatives of Jesus in all areas of life, Christians are called to treat others with dignity, compassion, and love (see Mark 12:31). Because of this, Calvary Preschool has implemented an anti-bullying policy for the students it serves. We understand that students at preschool level may not cognitively be capable of understanding the larger ramifications of their actions and may not understand the full scope of bullying, but we want to lay out a framework for the safety and well-being of all our students.

DEFINITION

Bullying occurs when a person or group is intimidated, frightened, excluded, or hurt by a pattern of behaviors directed at them by others.¹

The following actions, when ongoing, may be forms of bullying and are included in all references to "bullying" herein:

- Physical aggression including hitting, punching, and kicking
- Teasing or verbal abuse including insults, name calling, and racial/sexual remarks
- Intentional exclusion from activities or friendship groups
- The setting up of humiliating experiences
- Damaging a person's property/possessions or taking them without permission
- Threatening gestures, actions, and words
- Written/verbal/electronic messages that contain threats, putdowns, gossip, or slandering
- Cyberbullying through social media, texting, or other electronic means

POLICY OBJECTIVES

All members of Calvary Preschool's staff (employed and voluntary) have a responsibility to always be vigilant so incidents of bullying can be dealt with quickly and effectively. It is important to establish an atmosphere where children who are being bullied or others who know about specific incidents of bullying feel that they will be heard and believed. Everyone must feel confident that the action taken will be swift, sensitive, and appropriate to the circumstances.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF BULLYING

Children may indicate through their behavior that they are being bullied. Staff and parents should be aware of these signs and should investigate if the child:

- Is unwilling to go to preschool
- Becomes withdrawn, anxious, or lacking in confidence
- Cries himself/herself to sleep at night or has nightmares
- Claims to feel ill in the morning

PROCEDURES

- All bullying incidents must be reported immediately to the teacher and director.
- Staff members will record all reported bullying incidents on an Incident Report Form and share them with the director.
- In serious cases, parents will be informed and asked to come in to discuss the situation and problem(s).
- Bullying behavior or threats of bullying will be investigated quickly and fully.
- Staff will work to help those who are bullying to change their behavior. Further action may be taken at a later date if the bullying problem is not completely remedied.

PREVENTION

- Discuss and model positive behavior. Encourage children and share how they can make friends and interact with their peers.
- Set clear rules for behavior.
- Be vigilant.
- Use age-appropriate consequences for aggressive behavior.
- Help children learn to substitute alternative behaviors for aggression.
- Teach them to report to an adult.

Withdrawal/Dismissal of Students (Expulsion Policy)

Calvary Preschool reserves the right to dismiss/withdraw a child if they are unable to cope with preschool or if the parents fail to fulfill their obligations. Hitting, biting, or being consistently disruptive in the classroom is grounds for immediate dismissal, and tuition will be forfeited.

If a child is having behavioral problems, we will follow the guidelines laid out in our Discipline Policy, prior to the dismissal of a student.

If a parent wishes to withdraw their child from the program, they may do so with at least one month's written notice. If you fail to give the written notice, you will be charged for an additional month of tuition. If you fail to pay, further action will be taken.

CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT REPORTING

By law (NMCCR 8.16.2.21 sec. C.3), anyone who knows of or suspects that a child is being abused or neglected must report the matter immediately. All of Calvary Preschool staff follows this law.

Confidentiality Policy

All Calvary Preschool staff members have gone through confidentiality training and have signed a confidentiality statement. We cannot disclose any information about your child with an outside party or with other Calvary Preschool parents.

If we feel your child needs outside assistance, your permission and a signed authorization form will be the first step we take before we pursue action.

Complaint Process

If a Calvary Preschool parent has a complaint or a dispute, we ask you to follow the principles outlined in Matthew 18:5-7:

1. Bring the complaint/concern to your child's teacher and attempt to find a resolution.
2. If no resolution is found, take the complaint/concern to the director, who will schedule a meeting with the involved parties and attempt to reach a resolution.
3. If the above steps have been taken and there is still no resolution, take the complaint/concern to the school superintendent, who will attempt to resolve the matter.
4. If you feel no resolution has been found, you may write a letter to the church board, who will review your complaint and see what further actions need to be taken, if any.

Meals and Snacks

NUT ALLERGIES

CALVARY PRESCHOOL IS A PEANUT-FREE SCHOOL. Having a peanut allergy is severe and life-threatening. We ask that you do not bring products into the preschool area that contain peanuts.

SNACKS

Each student must bring their own nutritious snacks. **No sweets**, please.

BIRTHDAYS

If you wish, you may bring in a special treat on or around your child's birthday. Please request permission from the teacher in advance.

Celebrating a birthday with a party is a big deal for preschoolers. If you are planning on inviting children from your child's class to a party, but not the entire class, please do not pass out the invitations at school. Conversations about outside parties should be kept to a minimum in school in order to spare the feelings of children who are not invited.

LUNCH

All Calvary Preschool programs will have a scheduled lunch time. Parents are required to provide a lunch for their child since Calvary Preschool does not have a food program. We are unable to refrigerate items, so please pack an ice pack in your child's lunch. Please do not send food that requires heating. For the safety of our students, we cannot reheat or refrigerate food. Clearly label your child's name on their lunch box. Remember that we are a peanut-free school.

As a church body, we believe that the Scriptures teach that the best care for young children is given by their parents (see Deuteronomy 6:6-7 and Proverbs 22:6). However, we realize that sometimes there are extenuating circumstances that require both parents to work outside the home. Calvary Preschool staff is called to share in the ministry of Calvary Church by providing a loving and safe learning environment for children during the workday when circumstances prevent spouses or relatives from providing that care themselves.

If you would like your child to participate in our Before Care and After Care program, please select the appropriate option at time of registration. When signing up your child for this program, you agree to the following terms and conditions:

- You agree to payment guidelines.
- Calvary Preschool cannot prorate funds.
- If you wish to withdraw your child, you must give at least one-month's notice and fill out all necessary forms.
- Pickup for this program is promptly at 5 pm.
- Late-pickup fee (after 5 pm): you will be charged a \$5 fee for the first ten minutes and \$10 for each additional five minutes.
